Fangafrika takes us to Ouagadougou for a meeting with the best hip-hop bands of Western Africa gathered for a couple of days around the Ouaga Hip-Hop Festival. And it's as if hip-hop was born again here as it recovers its initial fighting energy. In Ouagadougou, hip hop stirs the undergrounds and the crowds.

For a couple of days, the city becomes the place to be for west-African hip-hop. The best rappers gather here making this festival the greatest event of Western Africa. Voodoo rap from Benin, hardcore hip-hop from Mali, rap from open country of Cameroon and feminist rap from Senegal take us into the reality of life in big cities...

Thanks to live shows excerpts, free styles, interviews of the fathers of rap and rising artists, Fangafrika is the first programme to uncover this musical trend which, far from copying the American or French rap, mixes classic hip-hop sounds with local instruments and languages. It's the only overview of the energy and diversity of this rap scene...
